## **NEWSLETTER - November 14, 2000**

<u>SPECIAL RELEASES</u> – On Saturday December 9<sup>th</sup>, we will have our fourth general release at 9 a.m. sharp. If you would prefer to have birds held for your own hunt, let me know prior to December 5<sup>th</sup>. Remember, the general release birds are \$10 each, and special release birds are \$13 each. Also, I will check with MacFarland regarding a delivery around Christmas. They charge more for birds each month (\$10.40 now) and orders of 100 or less have a \$50 delivery charge. They are now sold out, but have kept some for us.

<u>NOVEMBER 11 & 12 HUNT</u> – 100 Manchurians were released and over half were harvested during the weekend. This leaves a lot of birds. For any of you having a difficult time gathering your quota, let me know. We have 4-5 very good pheasant hunters that will help you out – all of them have excellent dogs and would like to hunt with you.



<u>BLACK PHEASANTS</u> – Leo LeFeber continues to win all of our contests, harvesting two on October 21<sup>st</sup> to win \$50, and harvesting two more on November 11<sup>th</sup> to take half of the pot. Mark Wiechman, Rusty, and Jerry Neumueller also shared in the November 11 pot of \$50.

## ATTENTION TO RULES – Please assist with the following:

- 1. Orange hats <u>must be worn</u> anytime you are pheasant hunting.
- 2. Do not shoot within 300 feet of anyone's home.
- 3. Register your harvest on pheasants, deer, and fish in our ledger in the garage. The DNR requires us to keep this record.

<u>PREDATORS</u> – We now have Art Sonnenberg trapping raccoons, and Leo LeFeber's friend is hunting them at night with dogs. Both have been very successful, along with our regular trapper, Clarence Rennert. We are paying a bounty of \$2 on raccoon, skunk or possum, and \$5 on coyote and fox this year to all approved hunters and trappers.

<u>FISHING</u> – Our pond has been 100% full with fresh well water for several months now. Fishing has been very good. We are checking into stocking it with Rainbow and Brown Trout as soon as I can obtain the required license. Larry Norum has been working on this and has been a lot of help. Call Larry (688-3712) or me if you have any ideas. We need to construct several fish hutches, so let me know if you want to help or build some on your own.
