BLACK BIRD: At our October 2nd release, Leo Lefeber shot the black bird along Van Dyne Creek near the North Werner fence line and won \$60. On October 23, Jerry Neumueller shot three black birds and won the drawing.

GUN RANGE SIGHT IN: The gun range has been completed on the end of Van Dyne Creek Road. Already it has had a lot of action. The distance is exactly 100 yards.

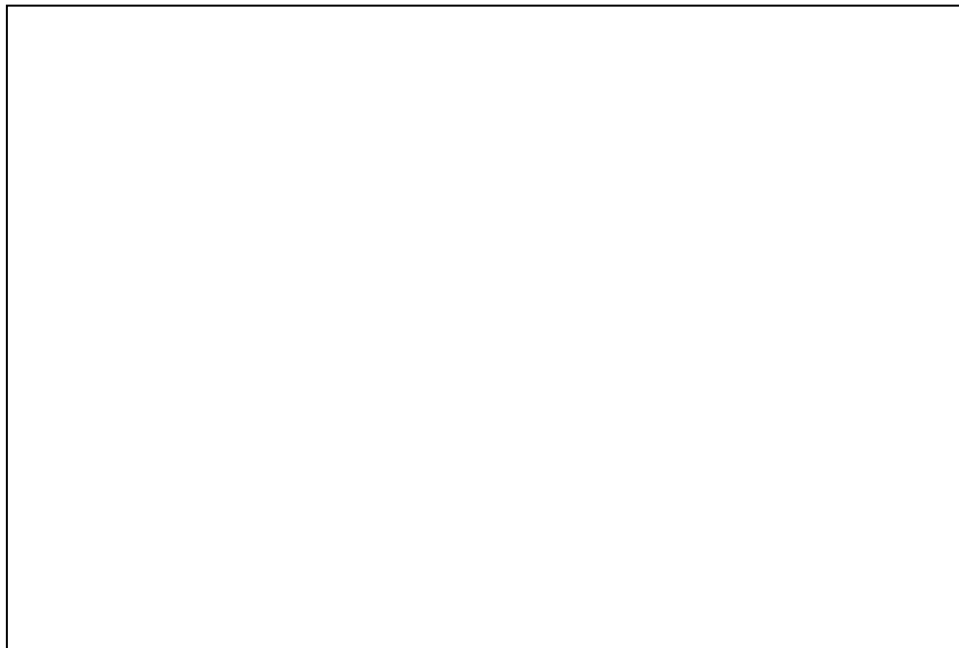
TRAP: Our trap has been redesigned, has been raised three feet, and will be left out there for your use. To assemble, you only need to turn one screw (30 seconds).

SPECIAL RELEASES: Our experiment with special releases has been very successful. To date, we have had five, with 50% to 100% retrieval. Last week I invited the Pheasants Forever board of directors for an afternoon hunt and cookout at our cottage. If some of you would like to do this, please let me know. The minimum order for special releases will be six birds and they should be released within ten days. I need special orders from you by November 8-9th. There is a sign on Howlett Road that designates when a special release is in progress.
